1 **Emergency preamble. Whereas,** acts and resolves of the Legislature do not 2 become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and Whereas, a legislative study by a study commission needs sufficient time for the 3 4 commission to properly do its work; and 5 Whereas, there is insufficient time after the 90-day period for a study commission to properly do its work before reporting to the Legislature; and 6 7 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as 8 immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, 9 10 therefore, be it Sec. 1. Commission To Strengthen and Align the Services Provided to 11 12 Maine's Veterans established. Resolved: That, notwithstanding Joint Rule 353, the Commission To Strengthen and Align the Services Provided to Maine's Veterans, 13 referred to in this resolve as "the commission," is established; and be it further 14 15 Sec. 2. Commission membership. Resolved: That the commission consists of 13 members appointed as follows: 16 1. One member of the Senate who sits on the Joint Standing Committee on Veterans 17 18 and Legal Affairs, appointed by the President of the Senate; 19 2. One member of the House of Representatives who sits on the Joint Standing Committee on Veterans and Legal Affairs, appointed by the Speaker of the House of 20 21 Representatives; 22 3. The Commissioner of Defense, Veterans and Emergency Management or the 23 commissioner's designee; 24 4. Five members appointed by the President of the Senate as follows: 25 A. Three members, representing 3 different veterans' service organizations in the 26 State; and 27 B. Two members with expertise in veterans' affairs policy or representing a nonprofit 28 organization providing services to veterans that is not a veterans' service organization; and 29 30 5. Five members appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives as 31 follows: 32 A. Three members, representing 3 different veterans' service organizations in the 33 State: and 34 B. Two members with expertise in veterans' affairs policy matters or representing a 35 nonprofit organization providing services to veterans that is not a veterans' service organization. 36

- 1 Of the members appointed, at least one member must be serving or have served in the 2 Maine Army National Guard, at least one member must be under 30 years of age, at least 3 one member must be between 30 and 40 years of age, at least one member must be 4 between 41 and 64 years of age, at least one member must be over 65 years of age, at 5 least 2 members must be women and at least one member must be a combat-wounded 6 veteran and amputee; and be it further
- Sec. 3. Cooperation. Resolved: That the Information Resource of Maine shall
 provide information and assistance to the commission as requested by the commission for
 the performance of its duties; and be it further
- 10 Sec. 4. Chairs. Resolved: That the Senate member is the Senate chair and the 11 House of Representatives member is the House chair of the commission; and be it further
- 12 Sec. 5. Appointments; convening of commission. Resolved: That all 13 appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this 14 resolve. The appointing authorities shall notify the Executive Director of the Legislative 15 Council once all appointments have been completed. The first meeting date must be set 16 within 15 days after and be held within 30 days after all appointments have been made; 17 and be it further
- 18 Sec. 6. Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall:
- 19 1. Review the services provided by the State to veterans for gaps, duplications and 20 inefficiencies;
- Study improving the State's engagement and communication with veterans of the
 conflicts in Afghanistan and Iraq;
- 3. Study how the State can provide health care and mental health services to the
 State's veterans when there is a clear gap in federal services;
- 4. Study how to better align community, state and federal services and resources forhomeless veterans;
- 5. Study how the State can develop and implement a campaign and marketing strategy to communicate with veterans and military retirees and encourage them to attend state colleges and to live and work in the State;
- Make recommendations to the Commissioner of Defense, Veterans and
 Emergency Management concerning practices and rules regarding services and programs
 for veterans and the development of a 5-year work plan; and
- 33 7. Make recommendations to the Joint Standing Committee on Veterans and Legal
 34 Affairs concerning changes to services and programs for veterans; and be it further
- 35 **Sec. 7. Staff assistance. Resolved:** That the Department of Defense, Veterans 36 and Emergency Management, Bureau of Maine Veterans' Services and the Office of 37 Policy and Legal Analysis shall provide necessary staffing services to the commission; 38 and be it further

1 Sec. 8. Report. Resolved: That, no later than December 2, 2015, the commission 2 shall submit a report that includes its findings and recommendations, including suggested 3 legislation, to the Joint Standing Committee on Veterans and Legal Affairs. The Joint 4 Standing Committee on Veterans and Legal Affairs may report out legislation to the 5 Second Regular Session of the 127th Legislature based upon the report.

- 6 **Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this 7 legislation takes effect when approved.
 - SUMMARY

9 This resolve establishes the Commission To Strengthen and Align the Services 10 Provided to Maine's Veterans, which must report by December 2, 2015 with its findings 11 and recommendations and suggested legislation to the Joint Standing Committee on 12 Veterans and Legal Affairs.

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
