Sec. 1. 36 MRSA §5219-LL, sub-§1, ¶A, as reallocated by RR 2013, c. 2, §46 is amended to read:
A. "Eligible primary care professional" means a person licensed under Title 32 chapter 31, subchapter 3 or subchapter 4; Title 32, chapter 36, subchapter 4; or Title 32, chapter 48, subchapter 2 and who, on or after January 1, 2013:
(1) First begins practicing Practices primary care medicine in the State beginning as part of an existing health care practice in an underserved area of establishing establishes a new health care practice or purchasing purchases are existing health care practice in an underserved area;
(2) Agrees to practice full time for at least 5 years <u>following certification unde</u> <u>subsection 3</u> in an underserved area;
(3) Is certified under subsection 3 to be eligible by the Department of Health and Human Services; and
(4) Has an unpaid student loan owed to an institution for course work directly related to that person's training in primary care medicine.
SUMMARY
This bill expands eligibility for the income tax credit for eligible new primary care professionals to include persons already practicing in underserved areas and certified as eligible by the Department of Health and Human Services in order to facilitate retention as well as recruitment of eligible professionals.
