RESOLUTION, Proposing an Amendment to the Constitution of Maine To Ensure That Laws Governing Hunting and Fishing Are Not Subject to the Citizen Petition Process

Resolved:** Two thirds of each branch of the 2 Legislature concurring, that the following amendment to the Constitution of Maine be 3 proposed:

Constitution, Art. IV, Pt. Third, §18, sub-§1 is amended to read:

5 1. Petition procedure. The electors may propose to the Legislature for its consideration any bill, resolve or resolution, including bills to amend or repeal emergency 6 7 legislation but not an amendment of the State Constitution and not an amendment to the laws of the State governing hunting and fishing, by written petition addressed to the 8 9 Legislature or to either branch thereof and filed in the office of the Secretary of State by 10 the hour of 5:00 p.m., on or before the 50th day after the date of convening of the Legislature in first regular session or on or before the 25th day after the date of convening 11 12 of the Legislature in second regular session, except that the written petition may not be filed in the office of the Secretary of State later than 18 months after the date the petition 13 14 form was furnished or approved by the Secretary of State. If the applicable deadline falls 15 on a Saturday, Sunday, or legal holiday, the period runs until the hour of 5:00 p.m., of the next day which is not a Saturday, Sunday, or legal holiday. 16

18 **Constitutional referendum procedure; form of question; effective date.** 19 **Resolved:** That the municipal officers of this State shall notify the inhabitants of their 20 respective cities, towns and plantations to meet, in the manner prescribed by law for 21 holding a statewide election, at a statewide election held in the month of November 22 following the passage of this resolution, to vote upon the ratification of the amendment 23 proposed in this resolution by voting upon the following question:

24 "Do you favor amending the Constitution of Maine to provide that laws
25 governing hunting or fishing may not be proposed through a citizen
26 initiative?"

27 The legal voters of each city, town and plantation shall vote by ballot on this question and designate their choice by a cross or check mark placed within the corresponding 28 square below the word "Yes" or "No." The ballots must be received, sorted, counted and 29 30 declared in open ward, town and plantation meetings and returns made to the Secretary of State in the same manner as votes for members of the Legislature. The Governor shall 31 review the returns. If it appears that a majority of the legal votes are cast in favor of the 32 amendment, the Governor shall proclaim that fact without delay and the amendment 33 34 becomes part of the Constitution of Maine on the date of the proclamation; and be it 35 further

36 Secretary of State shall prepare ballots. Resolved: That the Secretary of State
 37 shall prepare and furnish to each city, town and plantation all ballots, returns and copies
 38 of this resolution necessary to carry out the purposes of this referendum.

2	This resolution proposes to amend the Constitution of Maine to exclude from laws
3	that may be proposed in a citizen initiative laws governing hunting and fishing.
