1 SUMMARY

2 Current laws regarding gross sexual assault, unlawful sexual contact and unlawful 3 sexual touching prohibit relationships or contact by a person who is a psychiatrist, a 4 psychologist or licensed as a social worker or a person who purports to be a psychiatrist, 5 a psychologist or licensed as a social worker with a current patient or client. This bill 6 amends the laws regarding gross sexual assault, unlawful sexual contact and unlawful 7 sexual touching by adding additional medical professionals licensed under the Maine 8 Revised Statutes, Title 32 to the list of persons prohibited from having certain 9 relationships or contact with patients and adds the definition of "health care services 10 providers" to Title 17-A, chapter 11. "Health care services providers" includes physicians, osteopathic physicians, chiropractors, physical therapists, physician assistants 11 12 and nurses.
