COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 324, L.D. 933, Bill, "An Act To
10 Implement the Recommendations of the Task Force To End Student Hunger in Maine"

11

Amend the bill in Part A in section 2 in §6663 by striking out all of subsections 1 and
12 2 (page 1, lines 24 to 32 and page 2, lines 1 to 25 in L.D.) and inserting the following:

13

1. Commission membership. The commission consists of 11 members as follows:

14

A. One member of the Senate appointed by the President of the Senate, from the
15 party holding the largest number of seats in the Legislature;

16

B. One member of the House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the
17 House, from a party other than the party holding the largest number of seats in the
18 Legislature;

19

C. Three public members appointed by the President of the Senate, chosen from 3 of
20 the following options:

21

(1) One member from a statewide organization dedicated to food security;

22

(2) One member from a statewide or regional organization dedicated to
23 alleviating child hunger;

24

(3) One member from a statewide or regional organization that runs a food
25 pantry; and

26

(4) One member who is a food service director in a municipality or school
27 administrative unit that uses the United States Department of Agriculture
28 community eligibility provision, as provided in 42 United States Code, Section
29 1759a(a)(1)(F);

30

D. Three public members appointed by the Speaker of the House, chosen from 3 of
31 the following options:

32

(1) One member from a statewide or regional farm organization;

1 (2) One member from a statewide or regional organization that runs a school
2 food program for students in at-risk areas;

3 (3) One member who is a superintendent of a school administrative unit; and

4 (4) One member who is an elected official in a municipality that participates in
5 the United States Department of Agriculture community eligibility provision, as
6 provided in 42 United States Code, Section 1759a(a)(1)(F);

7 E. One public member appointed by the Governor who is a parent of a child who has
8 used or is using free or reduced-price student meal programs;

9 F. The commissioner or the commissioner's designee; and

10 G. The Commissioner of Health and Human Services or the commissioner's
11 designee.

12 2. Chairs. For the first 2 years of the commission, the Senate member is the Senate
13 chair and the House of Representatives member is the House chair. In subsequent years,
14 the chair of the commission must be elected by the members of the commission at the
15 first meeting of each year.'

16 Amend the bill in Part A in section 2 in §6663 in subsection 3 in the last line (page 2,
17 line 30 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "12" and inserting the following: '6'

18 Amend the bill in Part A in section 2 in §6663 by striking out all of subsection 5
19 (page 3, lines 12 to 15 in L.D.) and inserting the following:

20 '5. Staff assistance. The department shall provide necessary staffing services to the
21 commission.'

22 Amend the bill in Part A by striking out all of section 3 and inserting the following:

23 'Sec. A-3. Appropriations and allocations. The following appropriations and
24 allocations are made.

- 9 Amend the bill in Part C in section 1 by striking out all of subsection 1.
- 10 Amend the bill in Part C in section 1 by renumbering the subsections to read
- 11 consecutively.
- 12 Amend the bill in Part C by striking out all of section 2.
- 13 Amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or
- 14 section number to read consecutively.

SUMMARY

16 This amendment reduces the number of members of the Commission To End Student
17 Hunger from 17 to 11 and provides that the commission is staffed by the Department of
18 Education through the position created in Part C of the bill.

19 This amendment removes the provision of the bill that includes the full costs of
20 school nutrition as subsidizable costs in the school funding formula.

21 This amendment removes the provision of the bill that directs the Department of
22 Education to establish a grant program to help end student hunger.

23 This amendment removes the provision of the bill that directs the Department of
24 Education to convene a working group regarding the federal community eligibility
25 provision administered by the United States Department of Agriculture.

Fiscal Detail and Notes

This legislation establishes a new position to increase communication and cooperation between the Department of Education and the Department of Health and Human Services and to monitor child hunger and nutrition programs in both departments. It also requires the departments to provide school administrative units and schools with analyses of existing child hunger and nutrition programs and the funding not being used. The Department of Education has indicated that a Planning & Research Associate II position will be needed to perform these duties as well as to provide staffing services to the Commission to End Student Hunger. This bill includes General Fund appropriations of \$80,255 in fiscal year 2015-16 and \$80,842 in fiscal year 2016-17 to the School Finance and Operations program within the Department of Education to support the personal services and all other costs of the position. Other Special Revenue Funds base allocations of \$500 per year beginning in fiscal year 2015-16 are provided to establish an account for the Commission to End Student Hunger within the Department of Education that can be used to accept contributions and other sources of funds to support the work of the commission and 4 privately funded hunger coordinators.

This bill also includes General Fund appropriations of \$500 per year beginning in fiscal year 2015-16 to the Legislature for the per diem costs and other expenses of one member of the Senate and one member of the House of Representatives to participate in up to 4 meetings of the Commission to End Student Hunger during each interim period.

Any additional costs to the Department of Health and Human Services to adopt the changes in this bill are expected to be minor and can be absorbed within existing budgeted resources.
