1 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

2 **Sec. 1. 29-A MRSA §2411, sub-§9** is enacted to read:

3 **9. Emergency response costs.** A person who, while committing OUI under this
4 section, proximately causes an incident requiring an appropriate emergency response by a
5 private or public law enforcement agency, fire department or organization that provides
6 emergency medical services is liable for the costs of that response up to an amount of
7 \$2,500.

8 **SUMMARY**

9 This bill makes a person who, while criminally operating a motor vehicle while
10 intoxicated, proximately causes an incident requiring an emergency response liable for
11 the costs of that response up to an amount of \$2,500.
