A corrections officer who, while in the performance of duty, suffers bodily injury resulting from acts of a patient or prisoner in the custody of the jail, prison or state correctional facility where the corrections officer works and as a result of the injury is entitled to benefits under Title 39-A is entitled to a supplemental benefit in the amount of the difference between the weekly cash benefits to which the corrections officer's regular salary.   |
| 16<br>17                               | 3. Not chargeable against sick leave. Any absence from work resulting from the injury described in subsection 2 may not be charged against available sick leave credits.   |

| 19<br>20<br>21<br>22<br>23<br>24<br>25 | This bill provides for a supplemental benefit paid to a corrections officer who is<br>injured by the acts of a patient or prisoner of the jail, prison or state correctional facility<br>where the corrections officer works if the injury qualifies the corrections officer for<br>workers' compensation benefits. The amount of the supplemental benefit is the difference<br>between the corrections officer's workers' compensation benefits and the corrections<br>officer's regular salary. In addition, the work time the corrections officer misses is not<br>chargeable against available sick leave credits. |
