13 **Sec. 2. Annual cost-of-living adjustment.** The Department of Health and  
14 Human Services shall amend its rules in Chapter 101: MaineCare Benefits Manual,  
15 Chapter III, Section 2, Adult Family Care Services; Chapter III, Section 2, Section 97,  
16 Appendix C: Principles of Reimbursement for Medical and Remedial Service Facilities;  
17 and Chapter 115, Principles of Reimbursement for Residential Care Facilities - Room and  
18 Board Costs, to provide for ongoing, annual rate changes beginning July 1, 2015 to adjust  
19 for inflation. For each of the state fiscal years ending July 1, 2016 and July 1, 2017, the  
20 amount of the adjustment is 4%. For each year thereafter, the department shall set the  
21 inflation adjustment cost-of-living percentage change in reimbursement each year in  
22 accordance with the United States Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics  
23 Consumer Price Index medical care services index.

24 **SUMMARY**

25 This bill provides funds to give adult family care homes and Appendix C private  
26 nonmedical institutions a 4% cost-of-living rate increase in funding in each of the next 2  
27 fiscal years. Annual cost-of-living adjustments are provided by rule for each fiscal year  
28 thereafter in accordance with the United States Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor  
29 Statistics Consumer Price Index medical care services index.
