B, §3, is amended to read: 19 20 3. Administration of trust; director. The board shall annually appoint, using or 21 reappoint a qualified full-time director of the trust. When making an initial appointment 22 of an individual to the position of director of the trust, the board shall use a full and 23 competitive search process, a qualified full time director of the trust and a director's 24 initial appointment as director is subject to review by the joint standing committee of the 25 Legislature having jurisdiction over energy matters and to confirmation by the Senate. The Director of the Efficiency Maine Trust serves at the pleasure of the board. The 26 director must have demonstrated experience in the planning, design or delivery of energy 27 28 efficiency programs or the management of organizations that plan, design or deliver those 29 programs. The board shall establish the rate and amount of compensation of the director 30 and all other employees of the trust. The director: A. Serves as the president of the trust and as the liaison between the board and any 31 32 committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over energy matters; 33 B. Is responsible for: 34 (1) Establishing an office for the trust; 35 (2) Hiring and organizing staff for the trust and determining their qualifications

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and duties; and

May delegate to employees of the trust any powers and duties that the director 3 considers proper. 4 Amend the bill by striking out all of section 4. 5 Amend the amendment by striking out all of subsection 2 (page 1, lines 15 to 31 in 6 7 amendment) and inserting the following: 8 Efficiency Maine Trust funds. An amount equal to \$300,000 must be transferred annually to the office from the Efficiency Maine Trust, established in section 9 10103, unless federal funds are adequate to meet the funding needs of the office. Funds 10 transferred from the Efficiency Maine Trust may be used only for that portion of the 11 office's activities that support or reasonably relate to programs or activities of the 12 Efficiency Maine Trust. The commissioner shall keep an accounting of the office's 13 resources devoted to its various duties and activities, including that portion of its 14 resources devoted to activities in support of or reasonably related to programs or 15 16 activities of the Efficiency Maine Trust. The commissioner shall provide the accounting to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over energy matters 17 as part of its annual report under section 10205, subsection 3. The joint standing 18 19 committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over energy matters shall make recommendations to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction 20 over appropriations and financial affairs with regard to any proposed allocation of 21 Efficiency Maine Trust funds to support the office. In accordance with any legislative 22 23 allocation or deallocation of Efficiency Maine Trust funds to support the office, the commissioner shall request from the Efficiency Maine Trust and the trust shall provide 24 the allocated resources to the office.' 25 26 Amend the amendment by striking out all of section 8 and inserting the following: 27 'Sec. 8. Application of change to appointment process. Notwithstanding the 28 Maine Revised Statutes, Title 35-A, section 10103, subsection 3, the person holding the 29 position of director of the Efficiency Maine Trust on the effective date of this Act 30 remains the director of the trust under the procedure for appointment that was in law prior 31 to the effective date of this Act. 32 Sec. 9. Under this amendment, the Efficiency Maine Trust Board will annually appoint or reappoint the director of the trust, and a director's initial appointment is subject to review by the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over energy matters and to confirmation by the Senate. This amendment specifies that the change in the law governing the appointment process does not affect the appointment of the current director of the Efficiency Maine Trust.					
30 31 32 33 34 35 36 37	This amendment also clarifies the language in Committee Amendment "A" regarding the funding transferred to the Maine Energy Office from the Efficiency Maine Trust. Under this amendment, an amount equal to \$300,000 must be transferred annually to the office unless federal funds are adequate to meet the funding needs of the office. This amendment retains the language from Committee Amendment "A" restricting the use of funds from the trust for that portion of the office's activities that support or reasonably relate to programs or activities of the trust. This amendment replaces the appropriations and allocations section.

Fiscal Detail and Notes

This amendment removes the General Fund appropriations of \$90,483 and \$92,340 in fiscal years 2015-16 and 2016-17, respectively, that were in the committee amendment. It requires \$300,000 to be transferred annually from the Efficiency Maine Trust (EMT) to the Maine Energy Office (MEO) for activities supporting the EMT, unless federal funds are adequate to meet the funding needs of the office. The committee amendment had limited these transfers to a total of \$300,000 over time. The amendment adds Other Special Revenue Funds allocations to the MEO of \$232,138 and \$207,660 in fiscal years 2015-16 and 2016-17, respectively, to fund certain activities related to energy resources, planning and development. The amendment also adds Other Special Revenue Funds allocations of \$67,862 and \$92,340 in fiscal years 2015-16 and 2016-17, respectively, to establish a deputy commissioner position within the MEO. The amendment removes the emergency preamble and clause from the bill and this fiscal note assumes that the bill will become law on October 1, 2015.
