COMMITTEE AMENDMENT “**A**” to S.P. 453, L.D. 1271, Bill, “An Act To Protect Patients Who Need Eye Care”

Amend the bill in section 2 in paragraph A-1 in subparagraph (4) in the 4th line (page 2, line 4 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "ophthalmic lenses or contact lenses," and inserting the following: 'spectacle lenses.'

SUMMARY

This amendment strikes contact lenses from the section of the bill that allows a person or entity to dispense reading glasses without a prescription to clarify that the provision applies only to spectacle lenses.
