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L.D. 1301 Date: 6/3/15 (Filing No. S- )フラ) 2 3 TRANSPORTATION 4 Reproduced and distributed under the direction of the Secretary of the Senate. 5 STATE OF MAINE 6 **SENATE** 7 127TH LEGISLATURE 8 FIRST REGULAR SESSION COMMITTEE AMENDMENT " A" to S.P. 466, L.D. 1301, Bill, "An Act To 9 Improve the Safety of Vulnerable Users in Traffic and To Clarify the Responsibilities of 10 11 Bicyclists and Pedestrians" 12 Amend the bill in section 1 in subsection 91-A in the first line (page 1, line 3 in L.D.) 13 by inserting after the following: "means" the following: 'a person on a public way who is 14 more vulnerable to injury than a person in an automobile, truck or other similar motor 15 vehicle and includes, but is not limited to' 16 Amend the bill in section 1 in subsection 91-A in paragraph C in the first line (page 17 1, line 7 in L.D.) by inserting after the following: "way;" the following: 'or' 18 Amend the bill in section 1 in subsection 91-A in paragraph D by striking out all of 19 subparagraph (9) (page 1, line 20 in L.D.) 20 Amend the bill in section 1 in subsection 91-A in paragraph D in subparagraph (14) 21 (page 1, line 25 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "skis; or" and inserting the 22 following: 'skis.' 23 Amend the bill in section 1 in subsection 91-A in paragraph D by renumbering the 24 subparagraphs to read consecutively. 25 Amend the bill in section 1 in subsection 91-A by striking out all of paragraph E 26 (page 1, lines 26 and 27 in L.D.) 27 Amend the bill in section 2 by striking out all of subsection 4 (page 1, lines 30 to 33) 28 and page 2, lines 1 to 3 in L.D.) and inserting the following: 29 '4. Requirements. A driver education course approved under this subchapter must 30 include instruction that imparts the understanding and skills necessary to operate a motor 31 vehicle safely in a situation in which a motorcycle or vulnerable user is sharing the road 32 with that motor vehicle.' 33 Amend the bill by striking out all of sections 3 to 6 and inserting the following: 34 'Sec. 3. 29-A MRSA §2056, sub-§4, as amended by PL 1999, c. 101, §1, is 35 further amended to read:

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1 2 3 4	<b>4. Pedestrians in marked crosswalks.</b> When traffic-control devices are not in operation, an operator must yield the right-of-way to a pedestrian who is crossing within a marked crosswalk or to a pedestrian who has shown visible intent to enter the marked crosswalk.'
5 6	Amend the bill by striking out all of sections 9 and 10 (page 3, lines 24 to 37 and page 4, lines 1 and 2 in L.D.)
7 8	Amend the bill in section 11 by striking out all of subsection 7 (page 4, lines 5 to 9 in L.D.) and inserting the following:
9 10 11 12	'7. <b>Penalties.</b> A person 17 years of age or over who violates this section subsection 2, 3, 3-A, 4, 6, 9, 10, 11, 12 or 13 commits a traffic infraction for which a fine of not less than \$25 and not more than \$250 may be adjudged. A person under 17 years of age is not subject to a fine under this section.'
13	Amend the bill by striking out all of sections 12 and 13 and inserting the following:
14	'Sec. 12. 29-A MRSA §2063, sub-§§10 to 13 are enacted to read:
15 16 17 18 19 20	10. Duty to yield. A bicyclist, roller skier or other nonmotorized traffic must yield the right-of-way to a pedestrian crossing the way in a marked crosswalk who is proceeding in accordance with a traffic-control device as provided in section 2057 or who is proceeding without a traffic-control device in operation. For purposes of this subsection, "yield the right-of-way" means to slow or stop to avoid colliding with or causing other harm to a pedestrian.
21 22 23 24	11. Traffic-control devices. A person operating a bicycle or roller skis shall obey a traffic-control device, unless otherwise directed by a law enforcement officer. A traffic-control device conforming to the requirements for these devices is presumed to comply with this chapter.
25 26 27	12. Stop signs. Unless directed to proceed by a law enforcement officer or traffic-control device, a person operating a bicycle or roller skis approaching a stop sign shall stop and:
28 29	A. Yield the right-of-way to a vehicle that has entered the intersection or that is approaching so closely as to constitute an immediate hazard; and
30 31 32	B. Having yielded, a person operating a bicycle or roller skis may proceed. All other operators approaching the intersection shall yield the right-of-way to the person operating a bicycle or roller skis so proceeding.
33 34 35	13. One-way road. On a public way posted for one-way traffic, unless directed to proceed by a law enforcement officer or traffic-control device, a bicycle may be ridden only in the direction designated.'
36 37	Amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.
38	SUMMARY

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This amendment is the majority report of the Joint Standing Committee on

Transportation. The amendment does the following.

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## COMMITTEE AMENDMENT " A " to S.P. 466, L.D. 1301

- 1. It changes the definition of "vulnerable user" in the bill to remove motorcycles and to clarify that "vulnerable user" includes persons who are more vulnerable to injury than those in an automobile, truck or similar motor vehicle.
- 2. Like the bill, it requires that driver education courses include instruction regarding sharing the road with a vulnerable user, but the amendment eliminates the requirement in the bill that instruction include at least 30 minutes.
- 3. It strikes from the bill the provisions regarding pedestrians in crosswalks and instead adds new language to existing statute to specify that operators must yield the right-of-way to pedestrians who have shown visible intent to enter the marked crosswalk.
- 4. It retains provisions in the bill regarding responsibilities of bicyclists that are like responsibilities of motor vehicle operators but consolidates most of these provisions in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 29-A, section 2063, which addresses the rights and duties of bicyclists.
- 5. It strikes all proposed new prohibitions and penalties regarding vulnerable users, as the conduct and penalties are covered by current law in Titles 17-A and 29-A.
