It amends existing law 22 regarding education assistance grants to Maine National Guard members to govern the 23 distribution of the tuition benefit provided by the bill. Under the bill, tuition assistance is 24 provided in the form of waivers from a state postsecondary education institution. The 25 amendment provides that the Maine National Guard Postsecondary Fund will provide for 26 100% of an eligible member's tuition costs. If the tuition benefit costs exceed the amount 27 in the fund, the amendment states that the benefit will be provided in the form of a waiver 28 from the state postsecondary education institution. The amendment clarifies that tuition does not include lab fees or other mandatory fees charged to students. The amendment 29 30 specifies that the benefit entitles a member to one postsecondary education credential. 31 whether it be at the associate, baccalaureate, certificate or licensure level. 32 amendment specifies that a member must first pursue all other state, federal and 33 employer-provided benefits available and have not previously earned a bachelor's degree 34 in order to qualify for the tuition benefit proposed by the bill. The amendment also 35 strikes provisions in the bill that would eliminate certain potential sources of revenue to 36 be used for education assistance for members of the Maine National Guard. 37 FISCAL NOTE REQUIRED

Fiscal Detail and Notes

The bill establishes the Maine National Guard Postsecondary Fund within the Department of Defense, Veterans and Emergency Management and provides General Fund appropriations to the department of \$500,000 beginning in fiscal year 2015-16 to provide tuition assistance to eligible members.

The requirement that the University of Maine System, the Maine Community College System and Maine Maritime Academy waive tuition costs that exceed the amount of tuition benefit a member receives from the Maine National Guard Postsecondary Fund may result in a loss of tuition revenue to the State's public postsecondary educational institutions. The University of Maine System estimates it's loss of revenue to be approximately \$550,000 per year. No estimate is available for the other institutions at this time.
