1 **Sec. 1. Department of Professional and Financial Regulation to conduct a**
2 **sunrise review regarding the proposal to license court reporters and legal**
3 **recorders. Resolved:** That the Commissioner of Professional and Financial
4 Regulation shall conduct an independent assessment pursuant to the sunrise review
5 requirements in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 32, chapter 1-A, subchapter 2 of the
6 proposal to license court reporters and legal recorders; and be it further

7 **Sec. 2. Reporting date established. Resolved:** That, no later than February
8 17, 2016, the Commissioner of Professional and Financial Regulation shall submit a
9 report with any necessary legislation following the independent assessment under section
10 1 to the Joint Standing Committee on Labor, Commerce, Research and Economic
11 Development. That committee is authorized to submit legislation on the subject matter of
12 the report to the Second Regular Session of the 127th Legislature.

13 **SUMMARY**

14 This resolve requires the Commissioner of Professional and Financial Regulation to
15 conduct an independent assessment pursuant to the sunrise review requirements in the
16 Maine Revised Statutes of the proposal to license court reporters and legal recorders.
