3	1-A. Religious opposition exemption. A person may substitute articles of red
4	clothing for the articles of hunter orange clothing required under subsection 1 if the
5	person has a religious opposition to the wearing of hunter orange clothing.
6	Sec. 2. Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife to amend rules. The
7	Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife shall amend Rule Chapter 4: Hunting and
8	Trapping to clarify that a person who has a religious opposition to the wearing of hunter
9	orange clothing may substitute articles of red clothing for the articles of hunter orange
10	clothing required by current law. Rules amended pursuant to this section are routine
11	technical rules as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter
12	2-A.

14 15 16	This bill allows a hunter whose religion prohibits the wearing of hunter orange to instead wear red. It also directs the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife to amend its rules to reflect this exemption.
