2 Sec. 1. 27 MRSA §405, as amended by PL 2013, c. 181, §1, is further amended to 3 read:

4 §405. Hearings; contracts

5 The Maine Arts Commission is authorized and empowered to hold public and private hearings; to enter into contracts, within the limit of funds available, with individuals or 6 7 organizations, and institutions for services furthering the educational objectives of the 8 commission's programs; to enter into contracts, within the limit of funds available, with 9 local and regional associations for cooperative endeavors furthering the educational 10 objectives of the commission's programs; to establish and administer an endowment fund; to accept gifts, contributions and bequests of funds from individuals, foundations, 11 corporations and other organizations or institutions for the purpose of furthering the 12 commission's mission; to make and sign any agreements; and to do and perform any acts 13 that are necessary to carry out the purposes of this chapter. Any funds, if given as an 14 15 endowment, must be invested by the Treasurer of State according to the laws governing the investment of trust funds. As determined by the Director of the Maine Arts 16 Commission, with the approval of the commission, the endowment's principal and 17 18 interest may be used to further the commission's mission, as long as the endowment funds are used only for the purposes for which the endowment is established in accordance with 19 the intent of the donor. The commission may request and receive from any department, 20 21 division, board, bureau, commission or agency of the State such assistance and data as 22 necessary to carry out its powers and duties.

SUMMARY

This bill removes language that requires the Treasurer of State to invest funds given as an endowment for the Maine Arts Commission. It allows the Maine Arts Commission to administer its endowment fund.
