The State Court Administrator shall serve as a nonvoting member and provide such assistance as may be required by the commission. The Chief Justice of the Supreme Judicial Court shall name a member of the Supreme Judicial Court to serve as chair of the commission. The commission shall meet at the call of the chair and make a recommendation to the Chief Justice of the Supreme Judicial Court by January 1, 2017. The Judicial Branch is authorized to construct a courthouse in the municipality designated by the commission.'

SUMMARY

This amendment strikes the bill, which is a concept draft, and authorizes the Maine Governmental Facilities Authority to issue additional securities from time to time in an aggregate amount not to exceed \$95,600,000. The funds must be used for the acquisition, construction, equipping, capital repairs and improvements to new and existing facilities and judicial projects in the counties of Oxford, Waldo and York and planning for other court facilities, in order to increase court efficiency, reduce operating expenses and improve public service and safety.

 This amendment also establishes the York County Courthouse Site Selection Commission to choose a site for the new York County Courthouse. The Judicial Branch is authorized to build the courthouse in the municipality selected by the commission.

Legislative Cost/Study

The general operating expenses of participating in this commission are projected to be \$2,000 in fiscal year 2016-17. The Legislature's budget includes \$10,000 in fiscal year 2016-17 for legislative studies. Whether this amount is sufficient to fund all studies will depend on the number of studies authorized by the Legislative Council and the Legislature.

Fiscal Detail and Notes

This bill authorizes the Maine Governmental Facilities Authority to issue securities by \$95,600,000 to fund new courthouses in Waldo and York Counties and the renovation of and addition to a courthouse in Oxford County. The All-In True Interest Cost (All-In TIC) for the first bond issuance in July 2016 is assumed to be the current market rate plus .5%, or 3.36%. The second issuance in July 2017 is assumed to be the current market rate plus 1%, or 3.87%. The last bond issuance in July 2018 is assumed to be the current market rate plus 2%, or 4.89%. The assumed average All-In TIC for all three issuances is 4.18%. The estimated debt service cost to the judicial branch for the first two years is \$2,017,470 in fiscal year 2017-18 and \$5,481,883 fiscal year 2018-19.
