9 Sec. B-1. Law enforcement and county jail initiatives regarding treatment, recovery and support services. The Commissioner of Public Safety, 10 after receiving advice from the Maine Sheriffs' Association and the Maine Chiefs of 11 12 Police Association, shall administer grants to local law enforcement agencies and county 13 jails located in geographically diverse communities throughout the State to fund projects 14 designed solely to facilitate pathways to community-based treatment, recovery and support services. Grant applications must include statements of purpose and measurable 15 16 goals for the projects and use for the funds. Grant recipients shall report to the 17 Commissioner of Public Safety annually on the anniversary date of the grant award 18 regarding the status of the projects, a description of how the funds were spent, the results 19 of the projects and use of the funds and any recommendations for modification of the 20 projects, including any available information concerning their effectiveness in reducing 21 drug use and recidivism. The Commissioner of Public Safety shall provide a report summarizing the results of the grant program and providing recommendations as to its 22 23 continuation or modification and any need for additional funding by January 15, 2017 and 24 January 15, 2018 to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction 25 over criminal justice and public safety matters and the joint standing committee of the 26 Legislature having jurisdiction over judiciary matters.

 may not be transferred to any other appropriation or subdivision of an appropriation made
 by the Legislature.

25 'Sec. D-1. Peer support recovery centers; education and coordination of 26 services. The Department of Health and Human Services shall provide funds in an 27 expedited manner, beginning within 60 days after the effective date of this Part, in the 28 amount of \$700,000 to an organization with expertise and experience in substance abuse 29 prevention, treatment and peer recovery services to, on a statewide basis:

- Establish in underserved areas of the State and expand peer support recovery
 centers designed to assist individuals with substance abuse issues to avoid relapse;

10 Sec. D-5. Request for proposals. Except as provided in section 1, the 11 Department of Health and Human Services shall provide grant funds using the 12 competitive request for proposal bidding process set forth in the Maine Revised Statutes, 13 Title 5, chapter 155. 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

 a Healthy Maine.'

SUMMARY

This amendment, which is the minority report of the committee, makes the following changes to the bill.

10 1. In Part A, it:

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A. Adds the Joint Standing Committee on Criminal Justice and Public Safety to the 11 12 entities to which periodic reports must be made by the Commissioner of Public 13 Safety:

14 B. Adds funding provided by financial order 03451F16 to the unencumbered balances that may not be transferred; 15

16 Adds funding provided by financial order 03451F16 to the unencumbered 17 balances that may not lapse and restricts the nonlapsing year to fiscal year 2015-16 18 only;

19 D. Eliminates the appropriation for 10 investigative agents in fiscal year 2015-16 and 20 reduces the appropriation in fiscal year 2016-17 from \$1,600,000 to \$1,230,000; and

- 21 Adds a section to transfer \$1,230,000 from the Gambling Control Board 22 administrative expenses, Other Special Revenue Funds account to the unappropriated 23 surplus of the General Fund on or before the close of fiscal year 2016-17.
- 24 2. In Part B, it:
- 25 A. Requires the Department of Public Safety, rather than the Attorney General, to 26 administer the grants to local law enforcement agencies;
- 27 B. Requires consultation with the Maine Sheriffs' Association and the Maine Chiefs 28 of Police Association and requires enhanced reporting; and
- 29 C. Limits to fiscal year 2015-16 the period for which funds provided by this Part 30 may not lapse.
- 31 3. In Part C, it:

32 A. Changes the requirement for a new 10-bed detoxification center to a requirement for a new detoxification center with at least 10 beds; 33

- 34 B. Limits to fiscal year 2015-16 the period for which funds provided by this Part may not lapse; and 35
- 36 C. Changes the requirement that the center be in Bangor to a requirement that the 37 center be in a northern or eastern area of the State with high rates of opioid use and 38 accessible to related services and supports.

4. In Part C and Part D, it changes the reporting requirements so that the Commissioner of Health and Human Services reports periodically to the Joint Standing Committee on Health and Human Services rather than the Joint Standing Committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs.

5. In Part D, it:

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11 12 A. Limits to fiscal year 2015-16 the period for which funds provided by this Part may not lapse;

B. Removes the reference to the Maine Association of Substance Abuse Programs and directs the Department of Health and Human Services to provide funding within 60 days after the effective date of the Part to an organization with expertise and experience in substance abuse prevention, treatment and peer recovery services to provide substance abuse services statewide;

13 C. Adds to the services to be provided a requirement that coordination services 14 include links to career services and a requirement that the organization develop and 15 maintain a directory of providers and resources that is publicly available; and

16 D. Requires that although funding may be sole-sourced for fiscal years 2015-16 and 17 2016-17, future awards must be awarded on a competitive basis. It requires the 18 Department of Health and Human Services to issue a request for proposals by 19 January 1, 2017 that is competitively bid through the regular process pursuant to the 20 Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, chapter 155 for ongoing funding awards beginning 21 no later than July 1, 2017.

22 6. In Part E, it:

A. Limits to fiscal year 2015-16 the period for which funds provided by this Part may not lapse; and

B. Adds individual, group and intensive outpatient treatment to the substance abuse
outpatient services for the uninsured for which a funding increase is provided.

7. In Part F, it changes the source of the transfer to the unapporpriated surplus of the
 General Fund from the funds received pursuant to the court order in <u>State of Maine v.</u>
 <u>McGraw-Hill Companies, Inc. and Standard & Poor's Financial Services, LLC</u> to the
 Fund for a Healthy Maine.

8. It adds Part G, which transfers funds from Personal Services to All Other in the
Judicial Department, Courts - Supreme, Superior and District program, General Fund
account in fiscal year 2015-16 to provide funding to support increased criminal dockets,
including an increase in criminal jury trials.

Fiscal Detail and Notes

Part A of this bill includes a General Fund appropriation of \$1,230,000 in fiscal year 2016-17 to the Department of Public Safety to fund 10 investigative agents. Part A includes a one-time transfer of \$1,230,000 in fiscal year 2016-17 to the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund from the Gambling Control Board administrative expenses, Other Special Revenue Funds account.

Part B of this bill includes a General Fund appropriation of \$50,000 in fiscal years 2015-16 and 2016-17 for the Department of Public Safety to provide funding to local law enforcement entities.

Part C, D and E of this bill includes General Fund appropriations to The Department of Health and Human Services of \$675,000 in fiscal year 2015-16 and \$1,725,000 in fiscal year 2016-17. This funding will be used to provide multiple services, including funding for the development and operation of a detoxification center, ongoing funding for annual grants for the establishment and expansion of peer support recovery centers and the coordination and provision of substance abuse prevention and education in schools and communities, and ongoing funding to increase substance abuse residential treatment and outpatient services for the uninsured.

Part F of this bill provides one-time transfers of \$725,000 in fiscal year 2015-16 and \$1,775,000 in fiscal year 2016-17 to the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund from the Fund for a Healthy Maine.

Part G of this bill includes a General Fund line category transfer from Personal Services to All Other of \$240,000 in fiscal year 2015-16 for the Judicial Department.
