1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §1824-B is enacted to read:
3	§1824-B. Public postsecondary educational institution heating fuel purchases
4 5	1. Definitions. As used in this section, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms have the following meanings.
6 7	A. "Heating fuel" means a fuel used for the purpose of heating a residence or business.
8 9	B. "Public postsecondary educational institution" means the University of Maine System, the Maine Maritime Academy and the Maine Community College System.
10 11 12 13	2. Preference. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, when entering into a contract to purchase heating fuel, a public postsecondary educational institution shall give preference to companies producing in the State the type of heating fuel to be purchased under the contract.
14	SUMMARY
15 16 17	This bill requires the University of Maine System, the Maine Maritime Academy and the Maine Community College System, when entering into a contract for heating fuel, to give preference to companies producing that type of heating fuel in the State.
