The goal of the study and the pilot project is to improve access to essential programs and services for veterans, including, but not limited to, employment or employment-related services, medical appointments, mental health services, social services and community activities, and to inform potential future development of a long-term transportation policy designed to enable the delivery of cost-effective, sustainable and veteran-focused transportation services to meet the current and future needs of veterans in the State; and be it further

23 This amendment replaces the resolve and requires the Department of Transportation,  
24 in conjunction with the Department of Defense, Veterans and Emergency Management,  
25 the Department of Health and Human Services and the Department of Labor, to conduct a  
26 study, using available federal funds, to determine the need for locally available  
27 transportation services that convey veterans to and from employment or employment-  
28 related services, medical appointments, mental health services, social services and  
29 community activities. The purpose of the study is to inform the development of a pilot  
30 project to provide transportation for veterans in order to improve access to essential  
31 programs and services for veterans and to inform potential future development of a long-  
32 term transportation policy designed to enable the delivery of cost-effective, sustainable  
33 and veteran-focused transportation services to meet the current and future needs of  
34 veterans in the State.

35 This amendment also provides \$40,000 in one-time funding for the study.
