### Legislative Cost/Study

The general operating expenses of this study are projected to be \$625 in fiscal year 2015-16 and \$2,125 in fiscal year 2016-17. The Legislature's budget includes \$10,000 in fiscal year 2015-16 and \$10,000 in fiscal year 2016-17 for legislative studies. Whether the amounts are sufficient to fund all studies will depend on the number of studies authorized by the Legislative Council and the Legislature. The additional costs of providing staffing assistance to the study during the interim can be absorbed utilizing existing budgeted staff resources.

#### **Fiscal Detail and Notes**

Additional costs to the Department of Labor and the Department of Health and Human Services associated with the Commissioner or the commissioner's designee serving on the commission can be absorbed within existing budgeted resources.
