ORDERS

(4-1) On motion of Representative ESPLING of New Gloucester, the following House Order: (H.O. 13)

ORDERED, that the House Rules be amended by amending House Rule 503 to read:

Rule 503. Motions and concurrence. The following rules apply to motions and questions of concurrence with the Senate.

- A. When a question is under debate, a motion may not be received, except a motion:
- 1st. To adjourn;
 - ~~2nd. To table unassigned;~~
 - ~~3rd. 2nd.~~ For the previous question;
 - ~~4th. 3rd.~~ To commit;
 - ~~5th. 4th.~~ To table to a day certain;
 - ~~6th. 5th.~~ To amend; or
 - ~~7th. 6th.~~ To postpone indefinitely.

These motions have precedence in the order in which they are arranged. A motion to adjourn must be decided without debate. A motion to table unassigned is prohibited.

- B. Questions of concurrence with the Senate have precedence in the following order:
- 1st. To recede;
 - 2nd. To concur;
 - 3rd. To insist; or
 - 4th. To adhere.
