- 1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
- 2 Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §20054 is enacted to read:

3 §20054. Prohibition on operating a motor vehicle

6 7 <u>A person who is receiving methadone for the treatment of opioid dependency or for</u> <u>use as a pain medication is prohibited from operating a motor vehicle until the</u> <u>Department of the Secretary of State, Bureau of Motor Vehicles has received a medical</u> <u>report stating that the person is no longer receiving methadone treatment.</u>

8 Sec. 2. 22 MRSA §1711-C, sub-§6, ¶E-3 is enacted to read:

<u>E-3.</u> To the Department of the Secretary of State, Bureau of Motor Vehicles if the
<u>health care practitioner or facility is treating an individual with methadone for opioid</u>
<u>dependency or for use as a pain medication pursuant to Title 5, section 20054;</u>

12 Sec. 3. Secretary of State; rulemaking. The Department of the Secretary of State, Bureau of Motor Vehicles shall amend its Chapter 3 rules, "Physical, Emotional 13 and Mental Competence to Operate a Motor Vehicle," to require the reporting of 14 methadone treatment for opioid dependency or methadone use as a pain medication. The 15 16 rules must prohibit an individual who is receiving methadone from operating a motor 17 vehicle and require a health care practitioner or facility to report methadone treatment to 18 the Secretary of State's office and report when an individual is no longer receiving 19 methadone treatment. Rules adopted pursuant to this section are routine technical rules as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A. 20

21 SUMMARY

This bill prohibits the operating of a motor vehicle by a person who is receiving methadone for treatment of opioid dependency or for use as a pain medication. The Secretary of State shall amend its Chapter 3 rules, "Physical, Emotional and Mental Competence to Operate a Motor Vehicle," to require a health care practitioner or facility that is treating an individual with methadone to report to the Department of the Secretary of State, Bureau of Motor Vehicles. These rules are routine technical rules.
