1 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

2 **Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §12656, sub-§1, ¶B**, as enacted by PL 2003, c. 414, Pt. A, §2
3 and affected by c. 614, §9, is amended to read:

4 B. Except as otherwise provided, use any grapnel, spear, ~~spear gun~~ speargun, trawl,
5 weir, gaff, seine, gill net, trap or set lines for fishing.

6 ~~(1) A person may take suckers, eels, alewives and yellow perch in accordance~~
7 ~~with section 12506.~~

8 ~~(2) A person may take baitfish with a baitfish trap, as defined in section 10001,~~
9 ~~subsection 7.~~

10 **Sec. 2. 12 MRSA §12656, sub-§1-A** is enacted to read:

11 **1-A. Exceptions.** Notwithstanding subsection 1, paragraph B, a person may:

12 A. Take suckers, eels, alewives and yellow perch in accordance with section 12506;

13 B. Take baitfish with a baitfish trap, as defined in section 10001, subsection 7; and

14 C. Use a spear or speargun to fish for northern pike in Sebago Lake.

15 **SUMMARY**

16 This bill allows the use of a spear or speargun to fish for northern pike in Sebago
17 Lake.
