1 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

2 **Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §11154, sub-§5**, as amended by PL 2011, c. 370, §5, is further
3 amended to read:

4 **5. Eligibility.** Except as provided in this subsection, a resident, nonresident or alien
5 who is eligible to obtain a Maine hunting license or who will be eligible to obtain a
6 Maine hunting license by the opening day of the open moose season is eligible to apply
7 for a moose hunting permit. Beginning in 2011, a person who has obtained a moose
8 hunting permit is ineligible to obtain another permit until 3 years have elapsed after the
9 issuance of the last permit. This limitation does not apply to subpermittees under
10 subsection 7. A resident, nonresident or alien must be 8 years of age or older to be
11 eligible to apply for a moose hunting permit.

12 **SUMMARY**

13 This bill restricts eligibility to apply for a moose hunting permit to residents,
14 nonresidents and aliens 8 years of age and older.
