- 1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
- Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §13157-A, sub-§14, as enacted by PL 2003, c. 655, Pt. B,
 §414 and affected by §422, is amended to read:

14. Carrying passenger on ATV without headgear. Notwithstanding Title 29-A,
 section 2083, a person operating an ATV may not carry a passenger under 18 years of age
 on an the ATV unless the passenger is wearing protective headgear, except that the
 operator may carry a passenger who is not wearing protective headgear if the passenger is
 under 8 years of age and is riding directly adjacent to the operator on an ATV with
 side-by-side seating when the operator is a parent, grandparent or legal guardian of the
 passenger.

- 11A. A person who violates this subsection commits a civil violation for which a fine12of not less than \$100 nor more than \$500 may be adjudged.
- B. A person who violates this subsection after having been adjudicated as having
 committed 3 or more civil violations under this Part within the previous 5-year period
 commits a Class E crime.
- A person who violates this subsection commits a civil violation for which a fine of not
 less than \$100 nor more than \$500 may be adjudged.

 Class E crime.

SUMMARY

This bill provides an exemption to the requirement that a passenger under 18 years of age on an all-terrain vehicle wear protective headgear. The bill allows a parent, grandparent or legal guardian of a passenger to operate an all-terrain vehicle while the passenger on that all-terrain vehicle is not wearing protective headgear when the passenger is under 8 years of age and is riding directly adjacent to the operator on an all-terrain vehicle with side-by-side seating.
