1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2 3	<b>Sec. 1. 15 MRSA §455,</b> as repealed and replaced by PL 2003, c. 452, Pt. H, §1 and affected by Pt. X, §2, is amended to read:
4	§455. Sales of firearms
5	1. Forms. A dealer may not:
6 7 8	A. Sell, let or loan a firearm to a person without making a copy of the form a dealer must keep as prescribed by 18 United States Code, Section 923. The copy must be made and marked as "STATE COPY" before the firearm is delivered; or
9 10 11	B. Refuse to show or refuse to allow inspection of a copy of the form described in paragraph A to a sheriff, deputy sheriff, police officer, constable, game warden or prosecuting attorney.
12 13	A person who violates this subsection commits a civil violation for which a fine of \$50 may be adjudged.
14 15 16	<b>2. False or fictitious name.</b> A person may not give a false or fictitious name to a <u>firearms</u> dealer. A person who violates this subsection commits a civil violation for which a fine of \$50 may be adjudged.
17 18	3. Exception. This section does not apply to a wholesaler who sells only to other dealers or to a manufacturer who sells only at wholesale.
19	SUMMARY
20 21 22	This bill repeals the law that requires a firearms dealer who sells, lets or loans a firearm to make a copy of the form the dealer must keep pursuant to federal law and to show that copy to a law enforcement officer or prosecuting attorney.
