### An Act Regarding Referendum Recounts

1 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

2 **Sec. 1. 21-A MRSA §738, 2nd ¶**, as amended by PL 1993, c. 473, §32 and  
3 affected by §46, is further amended to read:

4 ~~On~~ If a referendum question prevails by a percentage difference between the yes and  
5 no votes of 0.25% or less, as shown by the official tabulation of the referendum votes, the  
6 Secretary of State shall conduct a recount paid for by the State. If the percentage  
7 difference between the yes and no votes is greater than 0.25%, on a petition signed by  
8 100 or more affected voters, a recount may be held on any referendum question by  
9 applying to the Secretary of State within the deadline provided in section 737-A. A  
10 deposit is required if the percentage difference between the yes and no votes falls within  
11 the requirements of section 737-A, subsection 1 The party requesting a recount of a  
12 referendum in which the percentage difference shown by the official tabulation is greater  
13 than 0.25% must pay for the recount. Appeal of challenged or disputed ballots is to the  
14 Supreme Judicial Court.

15 **SUMMARY**

16 This bill requires the Secretary of State to conduct a recount paid for by the State for  
17 a referendum if the percentage difference between the yes and no votes as shown by the  
18 official tabulation of the referendum votes is 0.25% or less. It allows a group of voters to  
19 request a recount for a referendum in which the percentage difference between the yes  
20 and no votes as shown in the official tabulation of the referendum votes is greater than  
21 0.25%. The party requesting a recount for a referendum in which the percentage  
22 difference between the yes and no votes as shown by the official tabulation is greater than  
23 0.25% must pay for the recount.
