9 COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 363, L.D. 519, Bill, "An Act To
10 Clarify Occupancy for Tents, Campers, Trailers and Other Devices used for Camping in
11 Unorganized Townships"

12 Amend the bill by striking out the title and substituting the following:

13 '**An Act To Allow the Storage of Tents, Campers, Trailers and Other Devices Used**
14 **for Camping in Campgrounds in the Unorganized Townships'**

15 Amend the bill by striking out everything after the enacting clause and before the
16 summary and inserting the following:

17 '**Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §685-C, sub-§12** is enacted to read:

18 **12. Campground storage.** The commission may not limit the number of days a
19 person may store an unoccupied camping device at a lawfully existing camping location
20 within a campground permitted by the commission or a campground that is a
21 nonconforming use. For the purposes of this subsection, "camping device" means a tent,
22 registered tent trailer, registered pickup camper, registered recreational vehicle, registered
23 trailer or similar device lawfully used for camping.'

24 **SUMMARY**

25 This amendment replaces the bill and changes the title. The amendment provides that
26 the Maine Land Use Planning Commission may not limit the number of days a person
27 may store an unoccupied camping device at a lawfully existing camping location within a
28 campground permitted by the commission or a campground that lawfully existed at the
29 time of district regulation and does not currently conform to district regulations.
