An Act To Provide for the Comprehensive Medical, Dental, Educational and Behavioral Assessment of Children Entering State Custody

- 1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 2 Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §4063-A, as enacted by PL 1991, c. 194, is amended to read: 3 §4063-A. Medical and psychological examination; comprehensive assessment 4 reimbursable 5 1. Physical examination required. The department shall ensure that a child ordered into its custody receives an appointment for a medical examination by a licensed 6 7 physician, physician's assistant or nurse practitioner within 10 3 working days after the 8 department's custody of the child commences. 9 2. Psychological assessment. If the physician or nurse practitioner who performs a physical examination pursuant to subsection 1 determines that a psychological assessment 10 of the child is appropriate, the department shall ensure that an appointment is obtained for 11 such an assessment within 30 days of the physical examination. 12 13 3. Comprehensive medical, dental, educational and mental health assessment. Within 60 days after the department's custody of a child commences, the department 14 15 shall ensure that the child receives an appointment for a comprehensive medical, dental, 16 educational and mental health assessment by a licensed pediatrician and a licensed child psychologist and provide reimbursement, including reimbursement for obtaining and 17 reviewing relevant records, under MaineCare for the assessment. The department shall 18 adopt routine technical rules pursuant to Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A to 19 20 implement this subsection.
- 22 This bill shortens the time requirement for the physical examination of a child 23 ordered into the custody of the Department of Health and Human Services from 10 days 24 after the department's custody of the child commences to 3 days and allows a physician's 25 assistant to conduct the examination. It also requires, within 60 days after the 26 department's custody of a child commences, that the child receives an appointment for a 27 comprehensive medical, dental, educational and mental health assessment by a licensed 28 pediatrician and a licensed child psychologist and that reimbursement, including 29 reimbursement for obtaining and reviewing relevant records, is provided under 30 MaineCare for the assessment. The department is directed to adopt routine technical 31 rules pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A.
