Amend the bill by inserting after section 1 the following:

'Sec. 2. 23 MRSA §4210-B, sub-§1, as amended by PL 2011, c. 649, Pt. E, §2, is further amended to read:

1. Establishment of fund. The Multimodal Transportation Fund, referred to in this section as "the Multimodal Transportation Fund" is established as an Other Special Revenue Funds program through the Department of Administrative and Financial Services. Funds Except as provided by subsection 8, funds appropriated, allocated, transferred or deposited in the account accrue interest earnings that must be used within the Multimodal Transportation Fund.

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Sec. 3. 23 MRSA §4210-B, sub-§8 is enacted to read:

8. Transfers from fund. At the close of each fiscal year, the State Controller shall 14 transfer to the Fund for Municipalities To Improve Pedestrian Safety, established in section 75, the uncommitted balance in the Multimodal Transportation Fund unallocated surplus account. Fiscal Detail and Notes

The bill includes a base allocation of \$500 beginning in fiscal year 2018-19 to establish the Fund for Municipalities to Improve Pedestrian Safety within the Department of Transportation. It requires a transfer of the uncommitted balance in the Multimodal Transportation Fund to the new fund every year. No estimate can be made of how much would be available to be transferred each year going forward, but any amounts transferred would reduce the amounts available for the purposes of the Multimodal Transportation Fund in subsequent years.
