Review cycle. The commissioner shall conduct a review of the content standards 16 and performance indicators by content area on a 5-year cycle beginning in the 2015-2016 17 school year. The review of the content standards and performance indicators for the 18 content area of social studies, including student achievement of proficiency in personal 19 finance, must be included in the commissioner's review during the 2015-2016 school 20 year. Any changes that are recommended must be approved through the same process 21 used for establishment of the system of learning results. Beginning in the 2016-2017 22 school year, the commissioner shall review and make recommendations for objective 23 measures that may be used to substantiate school certifications of postsecondary 24 readiness. The review of the content standards and performance indicators for the content 25 area of health, physical education and wellness, including instruction on affirmative 26 consent, communication and decision making regarding sexual activity and the effects of 27 alcoholic drinks, stimulants and narcotics on the ability to give affirmative consent, 28 communicate and make appropriate decisions, must be included in the commissioner's 29 review beginning in the 2017-2018 school year.' 30 **SUMMARY** 31 This amendment, which is the majority report of the committee, strikes the part of the 32 bill that requires a notation to be made on the transcript of a postsecondary student who is 33 convicted of sexual assault. This amendment requires the Commissioner of Education to 34 review the content standards and performance indicators for the content area of health,

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physical education and wellness, including instruction on affirmative consent,

communication and decision making regarding sexual activity and the effects of alcoholic

### **Fiscal Note**

### **State Mandates**

Requires that instruction involving affirmative consent, communication and decision making regarding sexual activity and the effects of alcoholic drinks, stimulants and narcotics on the ability to give affirmative consent be included in a secondary school's course of study in health, safety and physical education.

Moderate statewide

The required local activities in this bill may represent a state mandate pursuant to the Constitution of Maine. If the bill does require a local unit of government to expand or modify its activities so as to necessitate additional expenditures from local revenue, the state mandate provisions of the Constitution of Maine require either: (1) General Fund appropriations be provided to fund at least 90% of any additional necessitated local costs of the mandate; or (2) a Mandate Preamble be added to the bill and two-thirds of the members of each House vote to exempt the mandate from the funding requirement. If the bill does represent a state mandate and neither one of these actions occurs, the local units of government will not be required to implement the mandated activities.

### Fiscal Detail and Notes

Additional costs to the Department of Education to include affirmative consent, communication and decision making regarding sexual activity and the effects of alcoholic drinks, stimulants and narcotics on the ability to give affirmative consent in the commissioner's review of the content standards and performance indicators for the health, physical education and wellness content area during the 2017-2018 school year can be absorbed within existing budgeted resources.
