L.D. 768, Bill, "An Act To Establish 2 Comprehensive Licenses for Hunting and for
Hunting and Fishing"

Amend the amendment by striking out all of section 17 and inserting the following:

Sec. 17. 12 MRSA §12201, sub-§2, ¶D, as enacted by PL 2003, c. 414, Pt. A,
§2 and affected by c. 614, §9, is amended to read:

D. A nonresident who is a citizen of the United States is eligible to purchase a
nonresident trapping license.

Sec. 18. 12 MRSA §12201, sub-§2, ¶E, as enacted by PL 2017, c. 164, §14, is
amended to read:

E. ~~An alien~~ A nonresident who is not a citizen of the United States is eligible to
purchase only a nonresident trapping license for beaver pursuant to section 12259,
subsection 3.

SUMMARY

This amendment provides that a nonresident who is not a citizen of the United States
is eligible to purchase only a nonresident trapping license for beaver.
