20	This amendment, which is the majority report of the committee, removes the
21	provisions of the bill that establish comprehensive hunting licenses and comprehensive
22	combination hunting and fishing licenses. The amendment also eliminates the provisions
23	of the bill that allow the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife or a clerk or
24 25	other agent appointed by the commissioner to inquire of a license applicant which species
23 26	the applicant intends to hunt under the license and to limit the license to the species specified.
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27	The amendment retains the provisions of the bill that eliminate all alien licenses and
28 29	permits and that allow persons who are not citizens to purchase nonresident licenses and permits if they are not considered residents.
30	The amendment adds an effective date of January 1, 2019.

Fiscal Detail and Notes

This bill will eliminate all alien hunting and fishing licenses issued by the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife (IFW) and would allow persons who are not United States citizens to purchase nonresident hunting and fishing licenses instead. Starting January 1, 2019, the purchase of nonresident hunting and fishing licenses, which are less expensive than alien hunting and fishing licenses in all categories, will reduce General Fund revenue by \$5,132 in fiscal year 2018-19 and by \$10,264 annually thereafter.
