12	Amend the bill by striking out the title and substituting the following:
13	'An Act To Amend the Laws Governing Tagging of Harvested Animals '
14 15	Amend the bill in section 2 by striking out all of paragraph D (page 1, lines 12 to 16 in L.D.) and inserting the following:
16 17 18 19	'D. A person may keep an unregistered animal harvested by that person if that person notifies a game warden within 18 hours as to the location of that animal and the circumstances preventing the person from registering the animal in accordance with subsection 1.'
20	SUMMARY
21 22 23 24 25 26	This amendment allows a person to keep an unregistered animal harvested by the person for longer than otherwise allowed if the person notifies a game warden within 15 hours as to the location of that animal and the circumstances preventing the person from registering the animal. The bill allows a similar exception but only in circumstance when a registration station within a reasonable distance of the person is not open due to holiday or other legitimate reason.

Fiscal Detail and Notes

This bill creates an exemption that allows a person to keep an unregistered animal they harvest if they notify a game warden within 18 hours of the location of the animal and circumstances that prevented the person from registering the animal with a registration station. Any additional costs to the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife as a result of the exemption are anticipated to be minor and can be absorbed within existing resources.
