pharmacy students, residents and fellows in professional meetings, including educational meetings, as long as the program identifies such funding recipients based on independent institutional criteria and the funds are distributed to recipients without specific attribution to sponsors; or

<u>C.</u> Giving reasonable honoraria to a practitioner and making payment of the reasonable expenses, as defined by the board by rule pursuant to section 13720, of a practitioner at a professional or educational conference or meeting.

Rules adopted pursuant to this subsection are major substantive rules as defined in Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A.'

SUMMARY

This amendment, which is the unanimous report of the committee, strikes and replaces the bill. The amendment generally prohibits a licensed manufacturer or wholesaler of prescription drugs, or an agent of a licensed manufacturer or wholesaler of prescription drugs, from giving or offering to give gifts to an individual who is licensed, registered or otherwise authorized to prescribe and administer drugs in the course of professional practice. The amendment contains 3 exceptions to this prohibition, allowing a licensed manufacturer or wholesaler of prescription drugs to give:

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1. Noncash gifts of minimal value that will directly benefit the prescriber's patients;

Funding to support the participation of health care students, residents and fellows
in professional and educational meetings; and

3. Reasonable honoraria and payment for reasonable expenses of a practitioner at a
professional or educational conference or meeting.
