## 1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 21-A MRSA §1125, sub-§6, as amended by PL 2011, c. 389, §54, is
 further amended to read:

4 6. Restrictions on contributions and expenditures for certified candidates. After certification, a candidate must limit the candidate's campaign expenditures and 5 6 obligations, including outstanding obligations, to the revenues distributed to the candidate from the fund and may not accept any contributions unless specifically authorized by the 7 commission. Candidates may also accept and spend interest earned on fund revenues in 8 9 campaign bank accounts. Candidates may use a political party's nonprofit postage meter for campaign mailings. All revenues distributed to a certified candidate from the fund 10 must be used for campaign-related purposes. The candidate, the treasurer, the candidate's 11 committee authorized pursuant to section 1013-A, subsection 1 or any agent of the 12 candidate and committee may not use these revenues for any but campaign-related 13 The commission shall publish guidelines outlining permissible campaign-14 purposes. 15 related expenditures.

- This bill allows a candidate who receives funds under the Maine Clean Election Act
  to use a political party's nonprofit postage meter for campaign mailings.
