1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 2 Sec. 1. 32 MRSA §2582 is enacted to read: 3 §2582. Exemption for licensed person accompanying visiting athletic team 4 1. Licensed person accompanying visiting athletic team. This chapter does not 5 apply to a person who holds a current unrestricted license to practice osteopathic medicine and surgery in another state when the person, pursuant to a written agreement 6 7 with an athletic team located in the state in which the person holds the license, provides medical services to any of the following while the team is traveling to or from or 8 9 participating in a sporting event in the State: 10 A. A member of the athletic team: B. A member of the athletic team's coaching, communications, equipment or sports 11 12 medicine staff: 13 C. A member of a band or cheerleading squad accompanying the team; or D. The team's mascot. 14 15 2. Restrictions. A licensed person under subsection 1 may not provide medical services at a health care facility, including a hospital, ambulatory surgical facility or any 16 other facility where medical care, diagnosis or treatment is provided on an inpatient or 17 18 outpatient basis. 19 Sec. 2. 32 MRSA §3270-F is enacted to read: 20 §3270-F. Exemption for licensed person accompanying visiting athletic team 21 1. Licensed person accompanying visiting athletic team. This chapter does not 22 apply to a person who holds a current unrestricted license to practice medicine and 23 surgery in another state when the person, pursuant to a written agreement with an athletic 24 team located in the state in which the person holds the license, provides medical services 25 to any of the following while the team is traveling to or from or participating in a sporting 26 event in the State: 27 A. A member of the athletic team; 28 B. A member of the athletic team's coaching, communications, equipment or sports 29 medicine staff; 30 C. A member of a band or cheerleading squad accompanying the team; or 31 D. The team's mascot. 32 2. Restrictions. A licensed person under subsection 1 may not provide medical 33 services at a health care facility, including a hospital, ambulatory surgical facility or any 34 other facility where medical care, diagnosis or treatment is provided on an inpatient or 35 outpatient basis.

1	SUMMARY
2	This bill allows a person who holds a license to practice medicine and surgery or
3	osteopathic medicine and surgery in another state who accompanies an athletic team from
4	that state to provide medical services to members and supporting personnel of the team
5	without a license from this State but restricts the person from providing medical services
6	in a health care facility in the State.
