9 COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 709, L.D. 1008, Bill, "An Act To
10 Establish the Permanent Commission on the Status of Racial and Ethnic Populations"

11 Amend the bill in section 2 by striking out all of §25002 (page 1, lines 21 to 34 in
12 L.D.) and inserting the following:

13 **§25002. Membership**

14 The commission consists of the following members:

15 **1. Members of the Senate.** Two members of the Senate appointed by the President
16 of the Senate, including one member from each of the 2 parties holding the largest
17 number of seats in the Legislature;

18 **2. Members of the House of Representatives.** Three members of the House of
19 Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House, including members from each of
20 the 2 parties holding the largest number of seats in the Legislature; and

21 **3. Public members.** The following members representing the public:

22 A. A representative of a community economic development organization appointed
23 by the President of the Senate;

24 B. A representative of an economic policy organization appointed by the Speaker of
25 the House;

26 C. The district director of the Maine district office of the United States Small
27 Business Administration, or the district director's designee;

28 D. The president of the Maine State Chamber of Commerce or its successor
29 organization, or the president's designee;

30 E. Two members of the public that represent racial and ethnic populations in the
31 State, one of whom is appointed by the President of the Senate and one of whom is
32 appointed by the Speaker of the House; and

1 F. Three members of the public appointed by the Governor representing each of the
 2 following: the elderly, low-income people and youth.

3 The commission shall invite the participation, as a voting member, of a representative of
 4 a federally recognized Indian tribe in the State.

5 In making appointments, the Governor, the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the
 6 House shall consider and appoint residents of the State who have a knowledge of
 7 problems facing racial and ethnic populations in the State, who have experience in
 8 advocacy relating to racial and ethnic populations' issues and who provide leadership in
 9 programs or activities that improve opportunities for racial and ethnic populations. The
 10 members of the commission must be chosen from throughout the State, and the majority
 11 of members must be members of racial and ethnic populations.'

12 Amend the bill in section 2 in §25006 by striking out all of subsection 1 (page 2, lines
 13 23 and 24 in L.D.) and inserting the following:

14 '1. Research; policy proposals. Carrying out research necessary to determine the
 15 status of racial and ethnic populations in the State and considering policy proposals. The
 16 commission shall:

17 A. Study income levels of and opportunities available to historically disadvantaged
 18 racial and ethnic populations in the State and examine quantitative and qualitative
 19 data associated with those populations regarding business ownership, household
 20 assets, debts and income, housing, employment and access to inherited wealth, capital
 21 and benefits; and

22 B. Consider policy proposals to diversify business ownership to include historically
 23 disadvantaged racial and ethnic populations in the State and to bridge the gaps in
 24 wealth acquisition, including, but not limited to, proposals to:

25 (1) Develop a program to provide to aspiring and new business owners technical
 26 assistance workshops and training on topics such as the creation of business
 27 plans, accessing capital and funding and securing job training;

28 (2) Provide assistance to vendors to become registered with the State and create
 29 a clearinghouse to serve as a resource for state-registered vendors seeking
 30 government contracts; and

31 (3) Establish an office to coordinate the educational and technical assistance
 32 needs of emerging small businesses and to provide information to small
 33 businesses seeking to open, operate or expand their businesses;'

34 Amend the bill in section 2 in §25006 by striking out all of subsection 6 (page 3, lines
 35 1 and 2 in L.D.) and inserting the following:

36 '6. Reports. Beginning January 1, 2019 and biennially thereafter, reporting to the
 37 Governor and the Legislature concerning the work and interests of the commission.'

38 Amend the bill in section 3 in the 3rd line (page 3, line 14 in L.D.) by striking out the
 39 following: "the 4 appointed" and inserting the following: 'one appointed'

40 Amend the bill in section 3 in the 4th line (page 3, line 15 in L.D.) by striking out the
 41 following: "2 appointed" and inserting the following: '3 appointed'

1 Amend the bill by adding after section 3 the following:

2 'Sec. 4. Initial report. No later than March 1, 2018, the Permanent Commission
3 on the Status of Racial and Ethnic Populations established in the Maine Revised Statutes,
4 Title 5, section 12004-I, subsection 74-J shall submit a report that includes the
5 commission's findings and recommendations on the commission's research and
6 consideration of policy proposals pursuant to Title 5, section 25006, subsection 1,
7 including suggested legislation, for presentation to the Second Regular Session of the
8 128th Legislature.

9 Sec. 5. Appropriations and allocations. The following appropriations and
10 allocations are made.

13 Initiative: Provides funding for one Planning and Research Assistant I position and
14 related costs to provide support to the Permanent Commission on the Status of Racial and

23 SUMMARY

24 This amendment is the majority report of the committee. The amendment changes the
25 membership of the Permanent Commission on the Status of Racial and Ethnic
26 Populations, decreasing the total membership from 17 as proposed in the bill to 15 and
27 including Legislators in the membership. The amendment also expands the research
28 duties of the commission to incorporate the study of income levels of and opportunities
29 available to historically disadvantaged racial and ethnic populations in the State and the
30 examination of data regarding business ownership, household assets, debts and income,
31 housing, employment and access to inherited wealth, capital and benefits. It also directs
32 the commission to consider policy proposals to diversify business ownership to include
33 historically disadvantaged racial and ethnic populations in the State and to bridge the
34 gaps in wealth acquisition. The amendment adds an initial report by the commission to
35 the Second Regular Session of the 128th Legislature focusing on the commission's
36 research on income levels and consideration of policy proposals. The amendment also
37 specifies a due date of January 1st for the biennial report proposed in the bill, beginning
38 January 1, 2019. The amendment adds an appropriations and allocations section to the
39 bill.

Legislative Cost/Study

The general operating expenses of this study are projected to be \$2,500 in fiscal year 2017-18 and \$2,500 in fiscal year 2018-19. The Legislature's proposed budget includes \$10,000 in fiscal year 2017-18 and \$10,000 in fiscal year 2018-19 for legislative studies. Whether these amounts are sufficient to fund all studies will depend on the number of studies authorized by the Legislative Council and the Legislature.

Fiscal Detail and Notes

The bill includes a General Fund appropriation to the Department of Secretary of State of \$62,640 in fiscal year 2017-18 and \$65,521 in fiscal year 2018-19 for one Planning and Research Assistant I position and related costs.

The additional costs to the Executive Department are expected to be minor and can be absorbed utilizing existing budgeted resources.
