1 **Sec. 1. Cybersecurity Commission. Resolved:** That the Commissioner of
2 Administrative and Financial Services shall convene a cybersecurity commission,
3 referred to in this resolve as "the commission."

4 **Sec. 2. Membership. Resolved:** That the Commissioner of Administrative and
5 Financial Services shall invite the following to participate as members of the commission:

6 1. The Chief Information Officer of the Department of Administrative and Financial
7 Services;

8 2. The Chief Information Officer of the University of Maine System;

9 3. A member of the Maine National Guard who is an expert in information
10 technology security;

11 4. A public member who is an employee of a large health care provider in the State
12 and who has expertise in health care information technology;

13 5. Two public members who are experts in information technology;

14 6. A public member who is an expert in finance, business administration or
15 economics;

16 7. A public member with expertise in public safety; and

17 8. A public member with expertise in education; and be it further

18 **Sec. 3. Duties. Resolved:** That the commission shall study:

19 1. High-risk cybersecurity issues facing the State;

20 2. Securing state networks, systems and data, including interoperability, standardized
21 plans and procedures and evolving threats, and best practices to prevent the unauthorized
22 access, theft, alteration and destruction of the State's data;

23 3. Strategies to advance private sector cybersecurity economic development
24 opportunities, including innovative technologies, research and development and start-up
25 firms, and maximize public-private partnerships throughout the State;

26 4. Coordinating the review of and assessing opportunities for cybersecurity private
27 sector growth as it relates to military facilities and defense activities in the State;

28 5. Promoting awareness of cyber hygiene among the State's citizens, businesses and
29 government entities;

30 6. Cybersecurity and cybersecurity threats and summarize the data collected; and

31 7. Changes to laws and rules concerning programs and policies regarding
32 cybersecurity, information and technology and related matters; and be it further
