It is an affirmative defense to prosecution under this section that the evidence of 18 possession was obtained as a result of the person: 19 A. Seeking, in good faith, medical assistance for someone experiencing a drug-20 related overdose; or 21 B. Seeking or obtaining medical assistance for a drug-related overdose the person is 22 experiencing. 23 The assertion of an affirmative defense under this subsection is not grounds for 24 suppression of evidence with respect to any crime.' 25 SUMMARY 26 This amendment is the majority report of the committee. The amendment replaces 27 the bill. The amendment provides an affirmative defense in a prosecution for unlawful possession of scheduled drugs that the evidence of possession was obtained as a result of 28 29 the person seeking, in good faith, medical assistance for someone experiencing a drug-30 related overdose or seeking or obtaining medical assistance for a drug-related overdose 31 the person is experiencing. Unlike the bill, the amendment provides that the assertion of 32 this affirmative defense is not grounds for suppression of evidence with respect to any 33 crime. FISCAL NOTE REQUIRED
