HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 761,
L.D. 1083, Bill, "An Act To Increase the Penalties for Hunting Deer over Bait"

Amend the amendment by striking out all of section 1 and inserting the following:

'Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §10902, sub-§7-C is enacted to read:

7-C. Hunting deer over bait. A hunting license of a person convicted of placing or hunting over bait in violation of section 11452, subsection 1 must be revoked, and that person is ineligible to obtain a hunting license as follows:

A. For a first offense, for a period of one year from the date of conviction; and

B. For a 2nd offense, the person is permanently ineligible to obtain a hunting license.'

SUMMARY

This amendment amends Committee Amendment "A" to make a person convicted a 2nd time of placing or hunting over bait when hunting deer permanently ineligible to obtain a hunting license.

Requiring that a hunter who is convicted of placing or hunting deer over bait for a second time become permanently ineligible for a hunting license will reduce the number of licenses issued and reduce future General Fund revenue by a minor amount.
