1 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

2 **Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §6601-A** is enacted to read:

3 **§6601-A. National School Lunch Program; Internet-based school meal applications**

4 The department shall develop and make available to public schools an Internet-based
5 application for eligible students for free or reduced-price meals under the National School
6 Lunch Program under 7 Code of Federal Regulations, Part 210. A public school may
7 make the Internet-based application developed by the department available for school
8 meal applications. If a public school implements an Internet-based application process
9 under this section, the public school shall maintain paper applications for school meals.

10 **SUMMARY**

11 This bill requires the Department of Education to develop and make available to
12 public schools an Internet-based application for eligible students for free or reduced-price
13 meals under the National School Lunch Program. The bill provides that a public school
14 may make available the Internet-based application developed by the department for
15 school meal applications. The bill also provides that if a public school implements an
16 Internet-based application process, the public school is required to maintain paper
17 applications for school meals.
