COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "B" to H.P. 842, L.D. 1206, Bill, "An Act To Increase State Funding to Maine Public Charter Schools"

Amend the bill in section 1 in subsection 3 in the last paragraph in the last line (page 1, line 27 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "105%" and inserting the following: '100%'

SUMMARY

This amendment is the minority report of the committee. The amendment changes the multiplier for adjusting a public charter school's operating allocation to 100% rather than 105% as in the bill.

Fiscal Detail and Notes

Requiring that the State recognize 100% of a public charter school's operating allocation within essential programs and services will increase the total cost of public education from kindergarten to grade 12 beginning in fiscal year 2018-19. Although the amount can not be determined at this time, had this legislation required this provision be put into effect for fiscal year 2017-18 it would increase the total cost of K-12 public education, as proposed in LD 390, the Governor's 2018-2019 biennial budget, by approximately \$942,790. The amount of this cost increase not funded by the State will be borne by local school administrative units.
