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**SUMMARY** 1 2 This amendment, which is the majority report of the committee, provides for a one-3 time appropriation of \$500,000 from the General Fund to the Maine State Housing Authority for treatment of contaminated private drinking water wells for families with 4 household incomes no greater than 120% of the area median income. The amendment 5 limits the portion of the funds that can be used for marketing and outreach to \$50,000. 6 7 The amendment authorizes the authority to use up to 15% of the total funds for program 8 administration. ## Fiscal Detail and Notes

This bill includes a one-time General Fund appropriation of \$500,000 in fiscal year 2017-18 to the Maine State Housing Authority (MSHA) to provide grants and loans to eligible households for treatment of contaminated private drinking water wells.

The provision in this bill that allows MSHA to utilize 15% of the total funds provided to administer the program is expected to be sufficient to cover the administrative costs to MSHA.
