- 9 COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 438, L.D. 1286, Bill, "An Act To 10 Require Background Checks for All School Employees"
 - Amend the bill by striking out the title and substituting the following:

'An Act To Facilitate Compliance by School Employees with Criminal History
Record Check and Fingerprinting Requirements'

- Amend the bill by striking out everything after the enacting clause and before the summary and inserting the following:
 - 'Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §13026 is enacted to read:

17 <u>§13026. Compliance with criminal history record check and fingerprinting</u>
18 <u>requirements</u>

1. List of school administrative unit employees. Beginning January 1, 2018, and quarterly thereafter, a school administrative unit shall submit to the department a list of the names of all employees subject to certification, approval or authorization and indicate for each person included on the list the date on which the person most recently commenced employment with the school administrative unit.

24 **2.** Notification of noncompliance. Upon receipt of a list from a school 25 administrative unit pursuant to subsection 1, the department shall determine for each 26 person included on the list whether the person has complied with all applicable criminal 27 history record check and fingerprinting requirements of section 6103 and rules adopted 28 by the state board. If the department determines that the person has failed to comply with 29 any such applicable requirement, the department shall immediately notify the school 30 administrative unit of the person's failure to comply.

SUMMARY

This amendment changes the title, replaces the bill and requires, beginning January 1, 2018, a school administrative unit to submit quarterly to the Department of Education a list of the names of all employees and the date on which each person most recently commenced employment. Upon receipt of the list, the department is required to determine for each person included on the list whether the person has complied with all applicable criminal history record check and fingerprinting requirements. If any person has failed to comply with any applicable requirement, the department is required to immediately notify the school administrative unit of that person's failure to comply.

18 This amendment also provides ongoing funds for 90% of the cost to school 19 administrative units to comply with the bill as amended by this amendment.

The required local activities in this bill may represent a state mandate pursuant to the Constitution of Maine. If the bill does require a local unit of government to expand or modify its activities so as to necessitate additional expenditures from local revenue, the state mandate provisions of the Constitution of Maine require either: (1) General Fund appropriations be provided to fund at least 90% of any additional necessitated local costs of the mandate; or (2) a Mandate Preamble be added to the bill and two-thirds of the members of each House vote to exempt the mandate from the funding requirement. If the bill does represent a state mandate and neither one of these actions occurs, the local units of government will not be required to implement the mandated activities.

Fiscal Detail and Notes

State Mandates

This bill includes ongoing General Fund appropriations of \$13,244 in fiscal year 2017-18 and \$13,508 in fiscal year 2018-19 to the Learning Systems program within the Department of Education to fund 90% of the cost to local school administrative units to submit the names of all employees subject to certification, approval or authorization along with the date that each employee began working for the SAU. These estimates assume that the central office within each SAU will be responsible for compiling the data and submitting the report and that the data is up-to-date.

Additional costs to the Department of Education to determine if the employees whose names were submitted by the local school administrative unit have complied with all applicable criminal history record check and fingerprinting requirements and to notify the school administrative units if the employee failed to comply can be absorbed within existing budgeted resources.
