SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 439, L.D. 1287, Bill, "An Act To Strengthen Efforts To Recruit and Retain Primary Care Professionals and Dentists in Rural and Underserved Areas of the State"

Amend the bill in section 1 in subsection 2 in the 4th line (page 1, line 7 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "2017" and inserting the following: '2018'

Amend the bill in section 1 in subsection 2 in the 6th line (page 1, line 9 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "2017" and inserting the following: '2018'

Amend the bill in section 1 in subsection 2 in the 6th line (page 1, line 9 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "2022" and inserting the following: '2023'

Amend the bill in section 2 in subsection 3 in the 4th line (page 1, line 20 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "2017 through 2021" and inserting the following: '2018 through 2022'

Amend the bill in section 2 in subsection 3 in the 4th line (page 1, line 20 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "2015 2021" and inserting the following: '2015 2022'

Amend the bill in section 3 in subsection 6 in the first line (page 1, line 28 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "2026" and inserting the following: '2027'

### Fiscal Detail and Notes

The amendment delays the effective dates of the bill to extend the income tax credit for dentists who practice in underserved areas and increases the number of primary care professionals who may be certified for the primary care access credit. The incremental impact of the amendment is to reduce the General Fund revenue loss by \$47,040 in fiscal year 2017-18 and by \$82,320 in fiscal year 2018-19, and to reduce the Local Government Fund revenue loss by \$960 in fiscal year 2017-18 and by \$1,680 in fiscal year 2018-19. As amended, the bill would decrease General Fund revenue by \$47,040 in fiscal year 2018-19 and decrease Local Government Fund revenue by \$960 in fiscal year 2018-19.
