1 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

2 **CONCEPT DRAFT**

3 **SUMMARY**

4 This bill is a concept draft pursuant to Joint Rule 208.

5 This bill proposes to implement programs to facilitate the transition of persons from  
6 rehabilitation for drug or alcohol addiction or economic dependency to self-sufficiency  
7 by providing employment opportunities while allowing their employers to reduce their  
8 tax liability.

9 This bill would create a program, modeled on the federal Work Opportunity Tax  
10 Credit program operated by the United States Department of Labor, to encourage  
11 employers to hire from certain population segments, such as MaineCare and Medicare  
12 recipients, veterans, persons in the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families program or  
13 receiving general assistance, persons convicted of a crime who have been released from  
14 prison, persons recently out of residential treatment or detoxification for substance use  
15 disorder or who recently began medication-assisted treatment and disadvantaged teens.  
16 The incentives would consist of tax credits based on the wages paid to qualified persons  
17 and financial assistance for training costs.
