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1 SUMMARY

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This amendment is the majority report of the committee. It returns to the Department of Health and Human Services rule-making authority over establishing community-based drug overdose prevention programs, which is removed in the bill. It directs the department to provisionally adopt rules regarding community-based drug overdose prevention programs by January 15, 2018. It removes from the bill the appropriation for syringe exchange programs and naloxone hydrochloride distribution.
