36 37 38 39 40 41	This amendment, which is the unanimous report of the committee, grants the Board of Osteopathic Licensure and the Board of Licensure in Medicine the authority to request state and national criminal history information, including fingerprint-based criminal history information, for physicians who request expedited licensure under the Interstate Medical Licensure Compact. The State may not participate in the Interstate Medical Licensure Compact unless the boards have the authority to obtain and review this

information. The results of background checks received by the Board of Osteopathic Licensure or the Board of Licensure in Medicine are for official use only and may not be disseminated outside the boards. An applicant whose license has expired and who has not applied for renewal may request in writing that the State Bureau of Identification remove the applicant's fingerprints from the bureau's fingerprint file.

The amendment also makes a technical change to the bill regarding the process for an appeal on the determination of eligibility.

#### **Fiscal Detail and Notes**

Additional costs to the Board of Licensure in Medicine and the Board of Osteopathic Licensure, affiliated with the Department of Professional and Financial Regulation, to participate in the Interstate Medical Licensure Compact can be absorbed within each board's existing budgeted resources. This legislation may result in increased dedicated revenue to each board from licensing and renewal fees. The amount of revenue to be received will depend on the fees established by the interstate commission and the number of physicians that apply for an expedited license each fiscal year.

Additional costs to the Department of Public Safety associated with taking fingerprints and performing background checks can be absorbed within existing budgeted resources. Other Special Revenue Funds revenue will increase as the result of increased payments for background checks. No change in the budget is required.
