COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1004, L.D. 1454, Bill, "An Act To Extend the Time for an Appeal of Limited Entry Fishing License Denial for Members of the Military"

Amend the bill in section 2 in §6310-B in the last line (page 1, line 31 in L.D.) by inserting after the following: "license" the following: 'in accordance with the provisions of sections 6352 and 6353'

SUMMARY

This amendment provides for notice and the opportunity for a hearing to a person whose limited entry fishing license is revoked because the person did not provide the required landings data following a successful appeal of a denial of the license because of service in the United States Armed Forces or the United States Coast Guard.

Fiscal Detail and Notes

This bill modifies the criteria that allows a person who has been denied a limited entry fishing license as a result of their military service's impact on eligibility requirements to seek a waiver from the Department of Marine Resources. Because these waivers will allow more licenses to be issued to a limited number of individuals who previously were unable to qualify for a license, there may be a minor increase to General Fund and Other Special Revenue Funds revenue.
